I shall also hire a car, if such a thing is possible in Kimberley, so that I can get around. I'll ask my travel agent to get busy on all these details in the morning and will telegraph you over the weekend as soon as everything is finalised.

I hope that the police will allow me to visit you at home to check on your furniture needs. But I think it is essential, for both your protection and for me, that any such permission be given in writing. Once you get my telegram, to say when I am coming, can you fix this up? And will you contact me, either at

Kimberley airport or at the hotel?

I am so excited about seeing you again. It's been a long,

long time.

Thank you, by the way, for your letter of May 30. We can talk when we see each other.
