All buried in the grass yard, except otherwise stated.
Jonathan Lambert, an American, the first who made a settlement here, said to have been drowned, but supposed to have been murdered, before the English came here in 1816.

A sailor drank himself to death when the Falmouth was first sent to manure the island in 1816. The cabin where buried.

Thomas Corrie, an Italian, who had come here with Lambert, he died on the Sunday before the Julia was lost.

About 60 persons from the ship Julia, ^{lost on a Friday in Sept. 1817,} buried near the beach in Falmouth bay.

Thomas Brown, an ^{age about 17,} fell off the hill on Sunday night, March 2nd 1823. He had run away from his ship.

Smith found dead April 24th 1824; buried where found; he had left his ship, being senseless, & considered about distracted.

July 2nd 1832 Peter Peterson, an ^{age about 40, a settler; he had been hurt by a fall from the hill.}

Sept. 1831, An American Indian, age about 30, cook. Died of consumption. Dug one day when buried.

April 1840, A Frenchman, ^{age about 30,}

March 3rd 1843, William Eldridge, an American, " " 25, Died of complaint in the head, buried about 3 months.

Nov. 1843, Richard Meloni, do " " 20, " " consumption. " " 3 weeks.

March 29th 1850, John Anderson, an ^{The last four were left ashore sick, from whale ships.}

a whale ship, & called her Charlotten. ^{25. Found drowned. He had run away from all born on the island.}

March 28th 1828, Richard Riley. Born March 18th 1828, baptised March 26th 1828 (by Mr. St. J. J.)

March 10th 1835, Alexander Cotton. " Sept. 15th 1828; not baptised. Carried out to sea by a flood. ^{The body never found.}

Aug 26th 1839, Subaltern Richmond Bumpas Glasp. Born June 16th 1839. Not baptised.

April 10th 1843, Sybilista Richmond Bumpas Gyles. " July 11th 1841. Not baptised.

June 16th 1847, Harriet Ann Fullart Johnson. " July 23rd 1834. Baptised Oct. 12th 1835.
