Very heavy rain with thunder + lightning.

Sunny Mass 7 a.m. Canon Herford. M^{rs} Pirie called
in the afternoon + had tea. Father Thomas c.s.c.
came for a few days on the 4-8 p.m. train.
S^r Dorothea in bed all day. Solemn Evening
+ Sermon 6-30 p.m. the Chaplain.

Mass 7-15. Father Thomas c.s.c. Sister Dorothea had
her communion at the Cottage + got up for
Morning Tea. M^{rs} Symms + Father Comber came

At 2 p.m. Mother, the Assistant, & S^r E. Dorcas drove into Proctoria; the latter to have a driving lesson. Naton Gladys also came in to try & find a job. Father Clark & M^{rs} left on the 5-4 p.m. train. Mother took all the girls for a class at 6-30 p.m.

Horton Smith arrived for the Retreat on the 5-50 p.m. train also the three Sisters returned from East London; S^r Editha, S^r O. Irene, & S^r O. Frances; all looking so well. Girls service 6-30 p.m. Miss Crane came to see Mother about

Thursday.
May 8th

taking her Sister into the Home.

Mass 7-15. Mother drove into Pretoria & took S^r E.D. in for a car lesson & brought S^r Phyllis back to stay. All the Sisters, Visitors & Natives had tea in the new Dining Hall at the request of the girls. Mass 6-45 a.m. The Bishop. Mass 7-15 a.m. Fr. Hutten-Smith. In the afternoon Hilda Bretham, M^{rs} Dunning, & Miss Millsap came to see over the Home, all had tea with Mother in Trust. At 5-45 p.m. Mother & the Bp. in Madagascar went to a meeting at St. Martin's Church about the appointment of Fr. Levin as the new Chaplain. The Bp. of Pretoria was there. No classes.

Friday.
May 9th

Mass 6-45 a.m. The Bishop. Mass 7-15 a.m. Fr. Hutten-Smith. The Sisters' Retreat began at 5-30 p.m. with Vespers. All the School Sisters in it, one from Bloemfontein, & two East Coast Sister's from Johannesburg. Mother, S^r O.F., S^r Emmé, & S^r B. Mary, conf. of Retreat. S^r Dorothea left after dinner for St. Agnes' Provettenville where she went for the days of the Retreat. Miss Maeder returned at 9-30 a.m. Miss Dunning went to Johannesburg for the Retreat days. 17 Sisters in Retreat in all.

Octave Day of the
Dedication of the Basilica
May 11th

Mass 7-30. Retreat. No singing. Mother went up to Morning Tea at St. Mary's, & took the girls after noon tea. Mother & S^r Emmé took girls to Swinsbury at St. Martin's; some girls also went to the 7-30 a.m. Mass at St. Martin's; S^r D. Helen not well, went to bed with slight temperature!

Mass 6-45 a.m. in the little Chapel, the Bishop. Retreat Mass 7-30 a.m. Nothing unusual happened. The phone did not ring once the whole day! The Bishop came up

To see Mother at 11 a.m. S^r D. Helen all night & came to Mass.

Mass 6-45 a.m. The Bishop; in the little Chapel. 7-30 a.m. Retreat Mass. The van went into Portora at 11 a.m. M^r Tawse & M^r Kinnaird came out to see about the water at the Nursery in the afternoon. Mother went up to the Nursery to see them.

Wednesday.
May 14th

Mass 6-45 a.m. The Bishop; in the little Chapel. 7-30 a.m. Retreat Mass. Mother went into Portora at 10 a.m. to see about Salomia! The Bishop took the Girls Service in the Recreation Room at 6-30 p.m. The most perfect weather throughout - the Retreat + so warm.

Thursday.
May 15th

Mass 6-45 a.m. The Bishop; 7-30 a.m. Retreat Mass. Take after breakfast followed by the Bishop's blessing & the singing of the Te Deum. Most of the School left, S^r Joyce remained for one night. The East-Cristed Sisters left on the 10-20 a.m. train. S^r Mary Angela (Belona putain) went into the School for the morning & returned in the afternoon. S^r Dorothea returned from St. Agnes Prolettenville in the morning. The Bishop drove Fr. Holton-Smith into Johannesburg to see it. After Vespers Mother showed Fr. Holton-Smith round the Home, he left on the 8-13 p.m. train. S^r M. Angela left on the 6-55 p.m. train. At 7 p.m. the Bishop showed us a delightful film of this country & also of France.
