
RE: SECOND NATIONAL ANTI-PASS CONFERENCE.

On behalf of the Working Committee of the National Anti-Pass Council, I wish to congratulate all the members of the Native Representative Council for the stand and support they have rendered to the National Anti-Pass Council in its fight for the Abolition of the Pass-Laws. The Pass Laws are a negation of democracy, more in the spirit of Hitlerism which the sons of South Africa both black and white have just destroyed in the battle fields. These Laws are a denial to the elementary and fundamental principles of justices in a democratic country. The Pass Laws must go.

The struggle goes on. The National Anti-Pass Council in calling African and other progressive bodies at the Gandhi Hall, Fox Street, Johannesburg on Sunday 23rd June, 1946, at 10 A.M. Invitations to send delegates to attend this conference have been extended to national, official, political, cultural, educational, religious and sporting bodies, as well as to trade unions and other progressive organisations, both European and Non-European throughout the Union. From the response already being received, we are confident that the Conference will be an outstanding event in the history and lives of the people of our country.

If, However, you are unable to attend personally, we shall be very pleased if you send us a fraternal message which will be read at opening of the conference. The National Anti-Pass Council will give a full report of its activities and the Government's policy to maintain the pass system. The delegates will be given an opportunity to discuss the report and to take up new decisions in the lights of the facts disclosed in the report of the National Anti-Pass Council.
