Headline - *Military Convinced Wilson that Ian Smith Could not Be Beaten* – The release of cabinet papers, under the 30 year rule, shows that the Labour government under Harold Wilson, was led to believe that the UDI declared in Rhodesia by Ian Smith was supported by the British military.

This view is in direct conflict with Ken Flowers, who at the time, 1965, was a senior Commissioner of Police who was asked to set up a secret service organisation.
