## ★ VENUES:

The following venues have been suggested in Cape Town:

- i) Labia Cost: R 3500 per week  $\Rightarrow$  18 showings
- ii) Pinewood
- iii) UCT campus (only 16mm facilities) Cost: probably free if we book through CAG or host the function jointly.

- The Labia would probably have the best attendance.
- Other centres would have to make their own arrangements.

## ★ NATIONAL PROGRAMME:

Since the cost of imports used on a national basis will not be higher than the price quoted, it is cost-effective to use these films in a number of centres. This would also permit us to import 2 or 3 films at a reasonable rate for each centre. ( $\pm$  R 1 500 per centre)

### ★ LOCAL SCENARIO A:

- duration of film festival ~ 2 weeks  
(6 days per week)
  - two showings per night. (? 6.30 and 8.30 pm)
  - on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays the first showing is free, consisting of a selection of Provincial library films, plus other South African material;
  - the other 16 showings cost R3 per showing, and consist of
    - 4 x import 1
    - 4 x import 2
    - 3 x 'Steamers'
    - 3 x The Line
    - 1 x Gallipoli
    - 1 x Breaker Morant.
- plus preceding shorts using local SA material  
(? ECC video or conscription)

- assuming 100 people attend each paid showing the total takings =  $R3 \times 100 \times 16$   
= R 4 800

less 30% of 8 shows - R 720  
R 4 080

less costs - R 2 670  
R 1 410 PROFIT! ?

### ★ BUDGET PROPOSAL : (local scenario B)

### ★ Local Scenario B:

- duration of film festival - 1 week
- three showings per night (6:00, 8:00 and 10:00 pm)
- three free screenings of Provincial library films  
(6:00 pm Wednesday, 10:00 am and 2 p.m. Saturday)
- 17 paid showings at R3 a ticket
- same films as above, plus 1 x Deer Hunter.
- assuming 150 persons per showing takings are:

 R3 \times 150 \times 17 & = & R 7 650 \\
 \text{less 30% of 9 showings} & - & R 1 215 \\
 \text{less costs} & - & R 5 870 \\
 \hline

⇒ Net profit R 565

### ★ National Scenario:

- we have calculated that other centres would contribute R 1500 in total towards hiring of overseas films. This permits us to hire two films.
- we have calculated transport costs for these and other films at R 900. This may cover transport between urban centres, but could be an underestimate.
- we would require other centres to work out their own scenarios appropriate to
  - a) venues available
  - b) E&C workers available
  - c) audience,and hence calculate their own budgets. Media would probably need to be specific to each centre. A national budget could be worked out once each centre has drawn up their own budgets.
- we are attempting to obtain funding for this project (at present for a local film festival) separately from the current national budget.
