a. 1983 Programme

1. Poster work to continue as previous dates. Poster on agression against frontline states first priority. Botswana film society wants poster.

2. Training Programme:

Children's classes: at Museum art building. Ellen available as main teacher. Museum wishes to work closer with the children's classes, in the hope of building a primary school curriculum in art.

Adult classes: Thami, Gordon, Judy interested in teaching. Question raised as to the extent to which we should co-ordinate with the Artists Association of Botswana. If classes are specifically on the technical aspects of art, then we should work within AAB framework. Medu's aims are more towards socially-oriented art: should we hold seminars with this orientation instead for ourselves? Suggestion that we co-ordinate a teaching programme for adults with the Artists Association of Botswana on the technical level, and supplement such classes with seminars of our own say once a month. Furthur discussion tabled until after AAB meeting Friday, where presumable classes will be discussed.

Silkscreen workshop: agreed such a workshop should be run. (Note: we have P200 budgeted to print a pamphlet on silkscreen techniques.)

b. Contribution from unit to Newsletter. Gordon to write a comment on exhibition.

c. Art Centre:

Judy to report on immediate needs for printing space etc.

Gordon proposes a ideal silkscreen workshop.

Some discussion on whether we should aim at fulfilling our present needs only, or aim for a sophisticated teaching/printing environment. Hienz to write a proposal for Monday meeting on projected directions for a graphic arts centre and uses we might envisage for such a centre.

Also noted we need a store-room and a teaching room.

d. Poster on aggression: assigned to Thami.
