The Graphics Unit would like to offer the following courses over the comming year:

1. Introduction to drawing (2-3 monthslong, once a week): a basic drawing course, covering use of line, shading, perspective, etc. Students would work with still life and some human figure, and get a **c** feel for the most common drawing materials (pencil, pen and ink, conte crayon, etc.).

2. Introduction to colour (2-3 months long, once a week): a course in basic colour techniques and materials: mixing, shading, colour compements, k use of colour in graphic design, use of colour in realism, abstract and symbollic colour.

3. Life drawing (6 weeks to 2 months long): to give students a chance to use a model, to get some feeling for the problems of portraying movement, character, etc.

More developed drawing and painting courses, we would expect, should develop from XMXME these, given a positive XRE response from the community. We would expect later to offer intermediate courses in drawing, colour, perhaps oil paining and printing techniques, depending on MAMAMMXXXXimixXXXX public interest.

We would also like to run:

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4. A short workshop (a weekend perhaps) in silkscreen techniques.

5. A short workshop in graphic design and techniques.

6. Occaisional lectures on aspects of the graphic arts: e.g. art in Southern Africa today; traditional African art, and talks by individual artists about their own work.

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
