1. Posters:

2. Postcards: A London-based collective called Rhinocerous has offered to reproduce Medu posters as postcards, simultaniously reporducing them in Zimbabwe as well. Medu would get 10 % of final selling costs. (Rhinocerous also produces postcards for MAGIC, the work of George Grocz, Herschfeild, Lovis, etc.)

Meeting agreed to write Rhonocerous accepting this arrangement; chairman also mandated to bring this to the attention of the Medu executibe for comments. (Action: Thami.)

Graphics requests that P and R be asked to write comments for the back of the postcards. (Action: Judy)"

Rhinocerous has also suggested that we recommend to them other art from southern Africa which might be repooduced as postcards. Possible suggestions to be brought to the next meeting.

3. Murals of Maputo exhibit: Zimbabwe Publishing House has produced a book (written by Albie Sachs) on the Murals of Maputo. From the photos they have made blow-ups for museum exhibition, which is at present touring the SADCC countries. The Graphics Unit would like to arrange that this exhibition come to Gaborone; Thami to contact the museum for possbible arraggements.

The Graphics Unit requests that Medu buy at least 4 copies of the book **fox** to send to art collectives in South Africa.

4. Financial: Norad had requested immediate accounting for the money, and that it be spent.

- A. Thami to see Gordon about lightbox.
- B. Judy to by rest of capital equipment available in Gaborone. Full financial report to next meeting, copy to executive.

Freasurer reports we have not been recieving the bills from the printers etc.; several are overdue. Request executive: is the box being cleared?

5. Class revaluation: Ellen reported on Museum classes and proposals to write up hand book for teaching art.
