Very few artists get the chance to have their work shown to a wider audience.

The work is being collected in South Africa by the artists themselves and in this way we have managed to by-pass the established galleries and academic institutions and also reach artists whose works have never been exhibited before.

The exhibition promises to be comprehensive, dynamic and ultimately historic.

# **JULY 5TH TO JULY 9TH 1982**

An important aim of the exhibition is to provide the artists with an open forum to discuss and perhaps gauge the current direction of South African Culture. The purpose of the Symposium is to bring together expert knowledge and experience on the subject both from an historical and contemporary viewpoint.

Eminent persons involved in their respective fields have been invited to present papers and participate in panel discussions which will be open to the floor. These paper will be non-academic and popular in orientation. Hopefully many artists will be able to come to Gaborone to take part in the symposium.

The festival will run in the evenings, and includes films by South African film-makers, both documentary and feature film, music performed by prominent musicians, poetry, theatre and dance.

The papers, edited discussions, interviews etc will be published in book form which will be profusely illustrated with works from the exhibition.

As hotel accommodation is extremely expensive (minimum P30 just for a bed) the organizers have secured alternative accommodation. This is limited and will be provided on a first come first serve basis.
